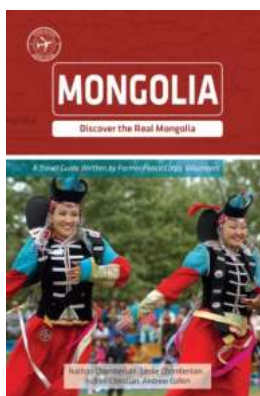

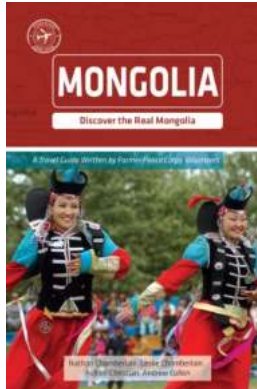

- Ride to where roads become pastures and pastures become desserts in the “Land of the Blue Sky.”



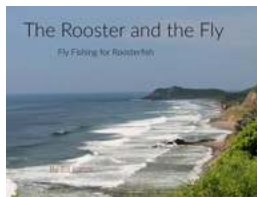
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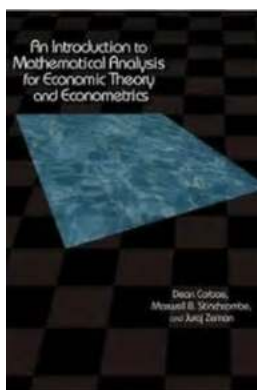
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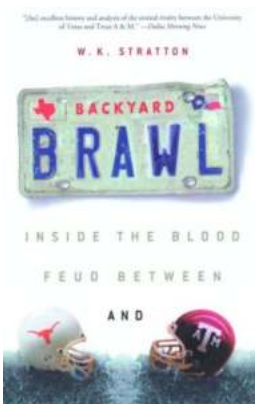
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
