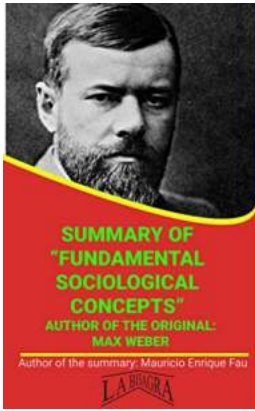

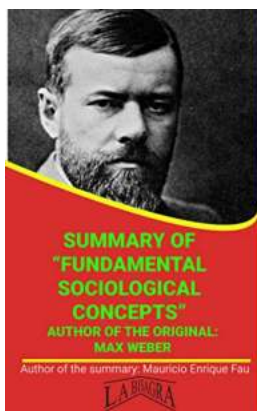

SOCIAL ACTION: action in which the subjective sense is **REFERRED TO THE CONDUCT OF OTHERS**.



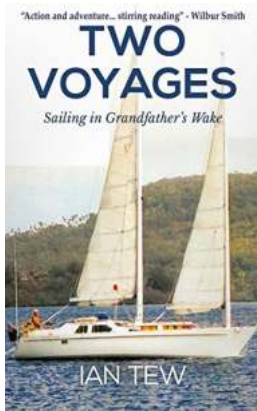
