

1943 saw the tide of war change fully in the Allies' favour. The Axis powers were in retreat on most fronts. In the Pacific, the Japanese had been soundly defeated at Midway in 1942 and were now suffering the consequences of the loss of so many aircraft carriers. They were severely weakened and the Americans were now undertaking the island hopping campaign that would continue through 1944. L.
