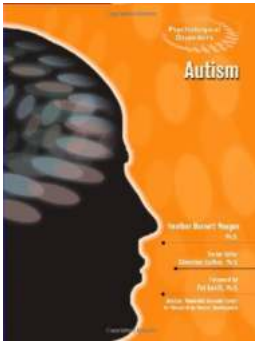
ABOUT THE AUTHOR
