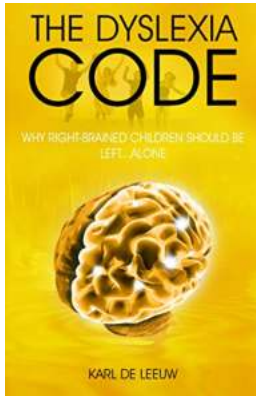

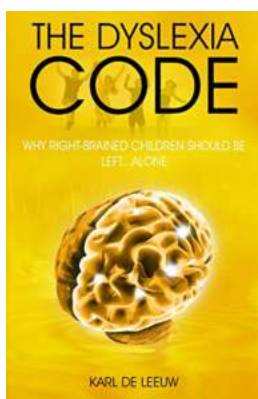

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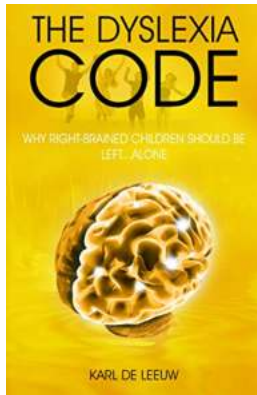


For far too long dyslexia has been seen as a curse. It's time to celebrate the gift that dyslexia can be.

After all, intelligence has a number of different forms.



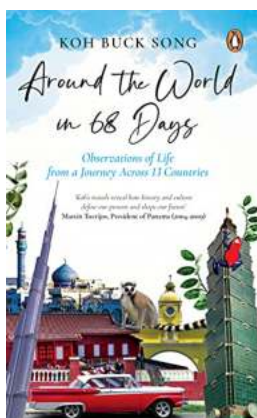
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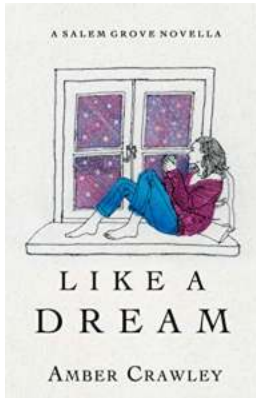
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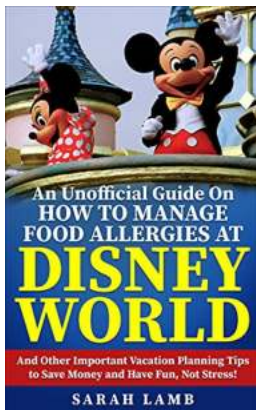
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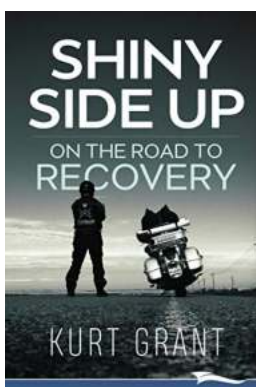
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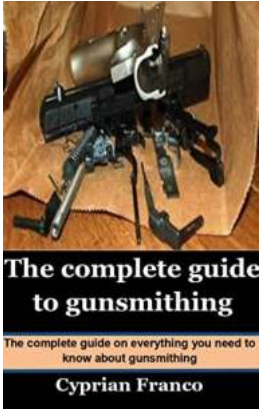
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
